What is this product?

Type

- This product is a class of share of the Sub-Fund and denominated in GBP. The Fund InRIS UCITS PLC is an open ended investment company with segregated liability between funds authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland on 19 July, 2013 as a UCITS pursuant to the UCITS Regulations.
- As an investment fund, the return of the Sub-Fund depends on the performance of its underlying assets.

Objectives

Investment objective

- The objective of the Sub-Fund is to achieve long-term capital appreciation through trading strategies that seek to have a return profile different from that of traditional asset classes, such as stocks and bonds.

Investment policy

- The Trading Advisor is free to choose how the assets of the Sub-Fund are invested within the limits of its investment policy and will utilise (typically with equal allocation) a series of three systemic trading models (the Long-Term Trend Following, Risk Premia and Market Neutral Equity models), which are part of its CFM Institutional Systemic Diversified Program (the "Program").
- The Sub-Fund will significantly invest in financial derivative instruments ("FDIs") for investment, efficient portfolio management and hedging purposes at any one time. The Trading Advisor will primarily trade to gain exposure to a diversified portfolio of global fixed income securities (including government bonds and notes), global interest rates, global currencies, global equities, global stock indices and global credit. For hedging purposes, the Sub-Fund may use FDIs to hedge against fluctuations in the relative values of its portfolio positions due to changes in currency exchange rates and market interest rates.
- The Sub-Fund, by virtue of the use of derivatives, may at any one time have significant cash balances to invest, which may be invested in money market funds (notably collective investment schemes) and money market instruments, including, but not limited to, certificates of deposit, fixed or floating rate notes and fixed or variable rate commercial paper (which are considered investment grade or above as rated by the principal rating agencies) and in cash deposits.
- There is no geographic or industry limitation to the investment universe.
- Investments may be made in emerging markets. The Sub-Fund will not invest more than 20% of its NAV in emerging markets, however, in normal market conditions, this investment will be less than 15% of the NAV.
- The securities to which the Sub-Fund will have exposure to will be listed or traded on a Regulated Market (subject to a 10% limit in unlisted securities).

- The Sub-Fund may invest up to 10% of the NAV in other collective investment schemes.
- The Sub-Fund is actively managed with an absolute return approach. Solely by virtue of the fact that it uses the Stoxx 600 Net Total Return Index (30%) and the Bloomberg Barclays Euro Aggregate Total Return Index Value Unhedged (70%) (the "Composite Benchmark") for performance comparison purposes only, the Sub-Fund is considered to be actively managed in reference to the Composite Benchmark. However, the Trading Advisor has full discretion over the composition of the Sub-Fund's portfolio, which is not constructed with any reference to the Composite Benchmark. The performance fee is not calculated with reference to the Composite Benchmark.
- The Trading Advisor takes into account sustainability risks by gradually introducing CO2 emissions based predictors to the equity market neutral portfolio within the Program, with the intention to improve the portfolio's overall risk-return profile. The Trading Advisor's research considers emissions, including Scope 3 emissions, but also transition and physical risks, in line with the Task Force on Climate-related Financial Disclosures ("TCFD framework"). The Trading Advisor uses metrics sourced from third party data providers, such as the Carbon Disclosure Project.
- Given the above objectives and the risk and reward profile of the product, the recommended holding period is 3 years.

Redemption and Dealing: You may redeem your investment on a daily basis ("Dealing Day"), on each Business Day as defined in the prospectus, no later than 11 a.m. (Irish time) two (2) Business Days prior to each Dealing Day.

Distribution Policy: This product does not pay dividends. Income generated by the Sub-Fund is reinvested and included in the value of your share.

Intended investor

This product may be appropriate for investors who have an investment horizon of 3 years or more and are prepared to accept a high level of volatility.

The class I GBP-H is available to all investors but are more specifically designed for institutional investors and collective investment schemes.

The minimum investment is GBP 1,800,000.

Term

This product was incorporated for an undefined period. The manufacturer may not terminate it unilaterally. Only the board of directors of the Fund or a general meeting of shareholders may decide to terminate this product.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risks



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because it is not able to pay you.

The product is classified in the category 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact the capacity of Alma Capital Investment Management to pay you.

Performance scenarios

The figures shown include all the costs of the product itself, but may not include all the costs that you pay to your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product. They are based on the following regulatory assumptions: (i) in the first year, you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return) and, for the other holding periods, the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario and (ii) £ 10,000 is invested.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period ("RHP"): 3 years

The RHP has been defined by taking account the above investment policy and risk and reward profile. You should be prepared to stay invested for at least 3 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty prior to the end of the RHP or hold the investment longer. Redemptions of shares will be effected each valuation day provided that the redemption notice has been received no later than 11:00 a.m. (Irish time) two (2) Business Days before the relevant Dealing Day. Applications received after that time will be considered for the following Dealing Day and processed on the next valuation day. The Sub-Fund reserves the right to impose an "anti dilution levy" in the event of receipt for processing of net subscriptions and/or redemptions, including subscriptions and redemptions which would be effected as a result of requests for conversion. Any cashing-in before the end of the recommended holding period may have a negative consequence on your investment.
